AFRICAN PEER REVIEW (APR), PANEL OF EMINENT PERSONS NOMINATIONS

The NEPAD/APRM Kenya Secretariat is a semi-autonomous Government Agency, under the Ministry of Devolution and Planning, whose core mandate is to promote Kenya's effective participation in the activities of the New Partnership for African Development (NEPAD) and the African Peer Review Mechanism (APRM). It is responsible for overall coordination and Monitoring of NEPAD and APRM Programmes and Projects in Kenya and the Eastern Africa region.

THE PANEL OF EMINENT PERSONS (ARP) PANEL NOMINATIONS

The African Peer Review (APR) Panel is a body of Eminent Africans appointed by the APR Forum with the responsibility to lead country reviews. One of the East Africa's Panelists is set to retire in January 2019 and this presents Kenya with an opportunity to front a candidate.

Duties and Responsibilities

The APR Panel has the following mandates:

- i) Exercise oversight of the APR process with a view to ensuring the independence, professionalism, and credibility of the process;
- ii) Oversee the selection of the APRM Teams and appoint them to conduct country reviews;
- iii) Recommend appropriate African institutions or individuals to conduct technical assessments;
- iv) Meet when required to review and make objective assessments and recommendations on the country review reports submitted to it by the APR Secretariat;
- v) Consider recommendations contained in the country review reports and make recommendations to the APR Forum;
- vi) Submit to the APR Forum all country review reports with recommendations on measures that could be taken to assist the country in the improvement of its governance and socio-economic development performance;

- vii) Develop its own rules of procedure, submit these to the APR Forum for approval and approve those of the APR Secretariat and the APR Teams.

Requirements for appointment

- i) Members of the APR Panel are African nationals of high moral stature, integrity, objectivity, impartiality and independence, who have distinguished themselves in careers that are considered relevant to the work of the APRM and;
- ii) Have demonstrated commitment to the ideals of Pan Africanism.
